

## How Courses Meet Anglican Studies Diploma Requirements

The Diploma in Anglican Studies is a 28-credit graduate-level program consisting of five required 3-credit courses (15 credits), one 3-credit course in each of four required areas of study (12 credits), and a one-credit course in Canon Law. No required course may be counted toward meeting an area requirement. No course may be counted toward more than one area requirement. If a course is listed as qualifying for credit under more than one area requirement, the student must designate, at the time of registration, the area toward which the student wishes the credit to be applied. Requests for changes and exceptions must be directed to and approved by the Academic Dean prior to the last day of classes.
