

Introduction to Pathways to Completion of the MDiv (81 credits)

The following pages provide pathways for completing the requirements for the MDiv degree in three, four, five, and six years. The pathways align with the current annual rotation of courses and maintain a reasonable balance of credits for each semester. Additionally, they follow the guiding principles below, designed to provide a logical progression of learning and formation.

- The pathways are designed so that students take foundational courses (Old Testament/Hebrew Bible and New Testament courses, Anglican Liturgy and Music: Development and Theology, Church History, Systematic Theology, and Art of Preaching) early in the program, prior to their mid-program review. The mid-program review takes place in a spring semester, concurrent with Field Education 3.
- Students should take Liturgy and Music: Development and Theology in their first semester, while Anglican Liturgy and Music: Theology and Practice fits best with Field Education 5 toward the end of the program.
- It is recommended that Hebrew Bible and New Testament courses be taken in sequence.
- Church History should be taken before Systematic Theology and is a prerequisite for Anglican and Episcopal History.
- Systematic Theology is a prerequisite for Anglican Theology and Ethics.
- Students must complete a minimum of 24 credits before enrolling in Field Education 2.
- Students are encouraged to take Congregational Leadership and Development elective courses after Field Education 2, or in other words, after completing at least one semester in their field education site. Field Education 2 is a prerequisite for the following courses:
 - Reimagining Congregations in Missions
 - Organizational Systems
 - Community Development for the New Age
 - Diversity and Context
 - Leading Non-profits in the 21st Century
 - Making Mission Possible in Tough Times
- Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) units should be completed prior to enrolling in Pastoral Theology. Students will benefit most from their experience when taking Pastoral Theology and Field Education 4 in the same semester.
- Students are advised to take Constitution and Canons in their final year before their General Ordination Exams (GOEs).
- Students must take at least 6 credits of their 15 General Elective credits through Bexley Seabury.

Advisement

Every fall and spring semester, students meet with their faculty advisors during a designated advising period to review degree progress and select courses for the upcoming terms. Required courses are ordinarily scheduled in the same term each year. In the event that adjustments need to be made, students will be notified well in advance. On occasion a course may be cancelled or moved for unexpected reasons. In that event, accommodations will be made to ensure that student progress toward graduation will not be delayed.

Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE)

All MDiv students must complete a unit of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) through an ACPE-accredited program. One unit of CPE is required (400 hrs; 300 hrs. clinical experience + 100 hrs. instruction). While the length of CPE programs will vary from place to place, they most typically run for an extended period of approximately 14 weeks in the fall (August - December) or spring (January-May); or for approximately 12 weeks as summer intensives (late May or early June through August). Some programs may be more extended and run over the course of two semesters.

CPE appears in each of the pathways in places that will give you a balanced course load in each year. However, you will need to make the choice of taking CPE as an extended or intensive program depending on the programs available to you in your local area and on the time you have available to commit to CPE in a given semester. It is not advisable to take any electives while you are taking an intensive summer CPE unit. You will need to manage your credit load carefully and plan well in advance.

The CPE requirement may be waived for students who demonstrate satisfactory completion of one unit of an ACPE-accredited CPE program within five years prior to admission to the BSSF MDiv program.

Anglican Formation

Formation for ministry is an integral component of the MDiv program as a whole, therefore MDiv students will enroll in Anglican Formation every fall and spring semester throughout the program. The formation class is designed to facilitate spiritual growth, to help students live into their ministerial identities, and to provide space for cultivating the learning community. Community making is especially important in a distributed learning program such as the Bexley Seabury MDiv. The zero-credit course consists of an on-site retreat at the beginning of the fall semester and the end of the spring semester, with monthly synchronous sessions online throughout the rest of the term.

Course Scheduling

Students are strongly encouraged to follow these pathways as closely as possible. Like GPS, the pathways offer the most efficient route to the destination of graduation. Students may need to deviate from the suggested pathways in some particulars. While this certainly is possible, students should keep in mind that side trips may increase the length of time to program completion and may lead to course scheduling conflicts or the unavailability of a course when you need it. Advisors must be consulted regarding any deviation from the pathways.

Keys to Reading the Pathways

- All courses are three credits, unless otherwise indicated.
- Currently, Bexley Seabury offers courses in three primary modalities.
 - Intensive courses are held on campus or at another site for at least one week in January or summer. Students will stay connected online and may have assignments to do before, after, or in between sessions on campus. Bexley Seabury's travel courses are also intensives.
 - Hybrid courses blend online teaching and learning (which may be entirely asynchronous or may involve regular synchronous sessions) with sessions that meet on campus for one or two weekends in fall and spring or fewer than five weekdays in January and summer.
 - Fully online courses do not require visits to campus. They are as interactive as possible
 and often include both synchronous and asynchronous elements, though some courses
 are offered in an entirely asynchronous format.

- o In *hyflex* courses, students will have the option to join the course onsite or participate entirely online.
- Field Education courses include synchronous online sessions in addition to work at the student's site placement.
- Semesters and Terms
 - o Fall Semester: early September through mid-December
 - January Term: month of January, though assignments may be due into the spring semester
 - o Spring Semester: end of January or early February through early May
 - o Summer Term: the Tuesday after Memorial Day through late July
